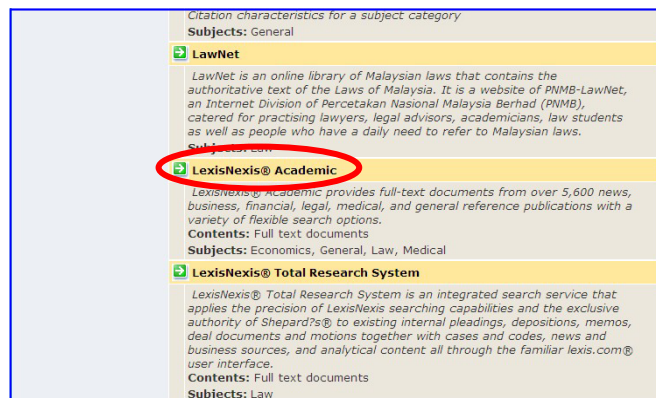

follow these simple steps:

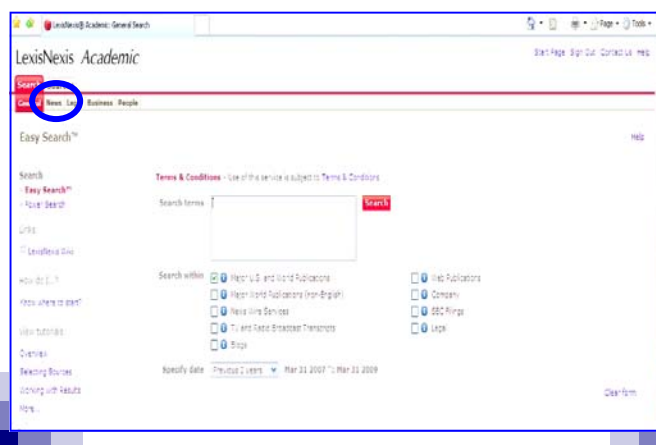
Access IIUM Library's Homepage
